It's spending as usual for Albertans this holiday season

-- TD Canada Trust poll finds Albertans will spend an average of \$76 per person on holiday gifts this year --

(November 22, 2011) CALGARY – Filling their shopping bags with festive treats, seven-in-ten Albertans say they won't be reducing their holiday spending this year despite the economic climate. According to the TD Canada Trust Holiday Poll, Albertans are planning to spend an average of \$1,250 on food, gifts and entertainment this holiday season.

While one quarter of Albertans hope to squeeze in all their holiday shopping for less than \$500, nearly as many (31%) expect to spend \$2,000 or more.
