More than a century ago Annie Davidson and founding members of the Calgary Women's Literacy Club stirred our city to action and secured the public and financial support to build the first library. They saw the Library cause as one to be invested in for their families and generations of Calgarians that would follow. Andrew Carnegie's donation of \$80,000 in 1908 helped to build this library and lives as a legacy of one of Calgary's first large philanthropic gifts.

The Calgary Public Library Foundation is proud of these entrepreneurial roots and we are pleased to carry on this work today. The Library Foundation was created in 1999 to provide an opportunity for individuals, businesses, and funding agencies to participate in building a great library system for both today

Ensuring openness and universal access

The Public Library is open for all, welcoming users of every ability, ethnic origin and financial capacity into both physical and virtual spaces that are friendly, trusted, neutral, and most importantly in the digital age, non-commercial.
