




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**HOT OFF THE PRESSES...THE 2014 WINE COUNTRY ONTARIO TRAVEL GUIDE

- Daniel Lenko Estate Winery boasts the oldest Chardonnay planting in Canada thanks to three generations of grape growing by the Lenko family
- Di Profio Wines is a family owned winery producing small lot wines using gravity flow winemaking
- Domaine Queylus proudly focuses on Pinot Noir, Chardonnay, Merlot and Cabernet Franc
- Karlo Estates offers North America's first Vegan-certified wines
- Rennie Estate Winery considers themselves a micro-vintner and is working with winemaker Shiraz Mottiar of Malvoire Wine Company
- The Ice House Winery is dedicated to producing "Canada's liquid gold"
- Two Sisters Vineyard is one of Niagara's newest wineries set to open this summer

"Wine Country Ontario is a unique tourist destination that offers consumers a real sense of place," adds Dawson "This annual guide represents a first step to understanding the true taste of Ontario."
