WHEN CINEMA BUILDS BRIDGES

The international symposium is organized by Wapikoni Mobile in collaboration with the Interdisciplinary Research Group on the Americas (GIRA), Montreal First Peoples Festival and Oxfam-Quebec, intended for the general public film and video makers, researchers, students, international organizations for audiovisual training and creation working towards the appropriation of media by Aboriginal people.

This symposium will culminate with the creation of the Réseau international de création audiovisuelle autochtone (RICAA) meaning International network for aboriginal audiovisual creation, allowing for long-term exchanges, the development of co-creation work between partners from different countries as well as wider distribution of works created.
